By now all residents should be aware that the Municipal Council passed a motion during the May 27<sup>th</sup>, 2008 council meeting declaring that **all dogs will not be allowed in the beach area located between the end of Sixth Avenue and the end Eighth Avenue during any time of the year.**

Would you not be offended or disgusted to see one of your fellow residents urinating in the sand that people play in at the beach? People should be equally offended by the thought of their pet relieving themselves in the sand as well. You might be able to “Poop & Scoop” if your pet does a “Job” at the beach but you have no way of removing the urine that is being deposited in the sand. Please comply with this regulation otherwise fines will be levied to all persons who are guilty of the offence.

**\*\*\*\*\* Parking Issues \*\*\*\*\***

Recently there have been many incidents whereby residents are parking their cars on the shoulder of the street and therefore impeding the flow of traffic. One street in particular is Commissioner Street. Please be advised that the shoulders of many of the streets are too narrow to accommodate the parking of cars without affecting the two way traffic on those streets and therefore it has been necessary to approach some property owners and request that they discontinue parking in this manner. The Township of Larder Lake is requesting that residents do not park their vehicles so that the traffic is affected or it will be necessary to declare that parking is prohibited on these streets. You will be requested by way of a letter from the Township of Larder Lake to move your vehicle if it is determined that your parked vehicle is affecting the flow of traffic. If cooperation can not be obtained, it will become necessary to prohibit parking on these narrow streets and your vehicle will be towed away at your cost.
